From Under the Presidents Helmet

Summer is coming to an end. "*How do you know*?" you ask. MI-TRALE had to the end of August to complete the required annual fall trail maintenance on our DNR designated trails. All 250 miles of them! It seems that as soon as we have some time to relax after a spring and summer full of projects, another project comes our way. We were able to complete the required maintenance on time. I encourage you to get involved with the maintenance of your trails. The designated trails must be completed twice a year. The first is end of May and the 2nd is the end of August. Please contact our Trail Manager if you would be willing to help.

"What have you been doing that takes so much time?" As most of you experienced, this past winter remained a challenge in the western UP until late May. There were several trails that we had to wait until June to complete our "spring" maintenance on, due to snow on the trail. Then there was the development of your new map that turned into a Western UP Multi-use Trails Guide. A one of a kind 142 page guide to recreation in the western UP, including 89 pages of detailed maps. This was a major load on our daylight hours. It took over 9 months and 1,000+ hours of time from our first meeting to final product. If you do not have one you should purchase one. If you already have one, then consider getting several as gifts for friends, and family. Go to our web page for purchasing information.

The board approved to install the newly adopted DNR trail identifiers (names) on all of your designated trails, all 250 miles of them. After over 5 years of working with the DNR to develop and approve this signage we felt that this was necessary to ensure your safety on the trail and to provide our riding guests with a more professional looking signs. This is another example of how your organization is making a difference in our sport. It is all part of making all of us proud to share our great trail system with others.

For those familiar with the challenging water holes on the west end of the Pioneer trail, near the Town of Bergland, they are gone. MI-TRALE worked with local contractors to restore the trail from old M28, east about 3 miles. We are working hard to remove the water holes near Victoria (east end of Pioneer) as well. For now, they remain a challenge. We have provided/signed an alternate route for those who would like to bypass these holes (challenges).

We have installed the 1st Responder signs in Gogebic County. We now have Ontonagon and Gogebic completed. We will work with the remaining counties this fall to complete the installation. Local snowmobile clubs have expressed an interest in installing the same signs on their trails. This is being led by MI-TRALE and is strongly supported by our local 1st responders.

The Equestrian Director and her team have been busy working on the MI-TRALE proposal for a new Multi-Use Equestrian friendly camp ground near the Courtney Equestrian Horse Trails. This is a major project with great benefits for all of us. It will become an economic draw for the western UP.

MI-TRALE is working with Ontonagon County local units of government to complete a proposal for an 800 acre Family Multi-Use Riding Park near Bruce Crossing. This is a beautiful area with room for many family recreational opportunities. We will keep you informed as this moves forward.

So, we have not been bored this summer. We have been working hard to build not only your trail systems, but the MI-TRALE image. We need your help in both of these areas. Help us locate new trail opportunities and new members. We rely on your to support to grow your organization.

"What can you do to help MI-TRALE?" You have taken the first step just by being a member. Our members help in 2 very important ways. First, your membership dollars are critical in helping us fund the projects that ensure that you have trails to ride and they are safe. Second, the larger your organization is, the more attention we can generate from not only our partners, but our local and State units of government. I ask that you ask a friend or 2 to join MI-TRALE. We have individual, family and business memberships available. Please make an effort to build your organization. You can join us at your annual banquet this year. Give you a chance to meet your board, but also meet several of your partners as well, and have some fun. Details will be included within the newsletter.

STEP GRANT NEWS:

MI-TRALE's STEP Grant Committee will be meeting soon to tie up loose ends on the Grade School Educational Events that took place the end of May. We all learned about Tread Lightly Principles and Invasive Species. What an exciting and fun time to work with the Forest Service, teachers in the Ewen and Ontonagon schools and the kids. Also, as a part of the grant we will begin plans involving teens, to work with MI-TRALE on the trails south of the Firesteel River.

As a reminder, here copied from The STEP Grant application, are the goals we face: *MI-TRALE hopes to save important sections of the equestrian trails from erosion, bringing them back to safe trail standards. A low lying area needs brushing and a culvert replacement (mostly south of the Firesteel River).* The trails need improved access to inlets and trail head, trail location signs and educational signs; Invasive Species, Tread Lightly and Leave no Trace.

The STEP Grant trail work has begun. One Sunday in July between the rain drops; a few of us from MI-TRALE worked on the northern most inlet to the trails off of Dishneau Road. Prior to that Janet Miesbauer worked on other areas south of the Firesteel. This work was related to the grant's goals and will be recorded as part of MI-TRALE's in-kind work requirements.

We are planning to improve our Equestrian Trail Awareness and help protect the land by installing new signage at The Courtney Equestrian Trails: 1) Trail Location Signs on Hwy M-38, 2) Invasive Species Signs, specifically so we "Trail Buffs" can watch for invasive's and do our part the get rid of them, 3) Share the Trails Signs –important for safety and considering respect among users on Multi-Use Trails.

LOGGING on THE COURTNEY EQ TRAILS:

There is still logging going on in that area, so please use caution.
